Housing

The university operates modern residence hall facilities for both men and women. Residence hall living is designed to complement the academic curriculum by providing a favorable climate for learning and opportunities for personal growth. A program of differentiated housing permits students and parents or guardians to select the kind of facility and living atmosphere best suited to their needs. The university requires all single freshmen and sophomores to live on campus. Residence halls are steam heated and furnished except for bed linens, blankets, towels, and accessories. The latest in sophisticated telephone equipment is available to the residence halls. All housing is air-conditioned. Beds are single beds.

In order to provide campus housing for students at the lowest possible cost, a housing agreement is made between the applicants and the university for the full academic year, consisting of the fall and spring semesters. Terms and conditions of this agreement are included in the housing information and application booklet. All freshman year students living in the residence hall are required to buy one of the meal plan options offered by Sodexo dining services.

Residence halls are opened the day prior to the beginning of the semester. They are closed during fall break, Thanksgiving, Christmas, spring break and summer vacation except for Browning Hall, which is open during breaks. When students room alone in double rooms, an additional \$450 per semester is charged. For current rates, call the Office of Housing at 731-881-7730. Residence Halls for Women

Jim McCord Hall is located south of Clement Hall and southeast of Boling University Center. The air-conditioned rooms have connecting baths. Basic telephone service is provided in each room. McCord residents must bring their own phone. Basic cable and data connections are provided in each room. Total capacity is 453.

Cooper Hall furnishes modern apartment-type facilities for 161 occupants. The rooms of the four-story, air-conditioned building are arranged in suites around the four sides of a rectangular atrium or courtyard. Telephone, basic cable, and data connections are provided in each room. Residents must bring their phone. Suites will accommodate eight women. A few single rooms are available for \$410 extra. Buford Ellington Hall North is located just south of Boling University Center. This hall is also air-conditioned, and rooms have connecting baths. Telephone, basic cable, and data connections are provided in each room. Residents must bring their phone. The North Unit has space for 225 residents.

Browning Residence Hall North is located on the southwest perimeter of the main campus. The hall is air-conditioned, and rooms have connecting baths. Telephone, basic cable, and data connections are provided in each room. Residents must bring their phone. Women residents are assigned to the North unit. Total capacity is 227.

University Courts Building A is located just south of the main campus at the corner of Peach Street and Mt. Pelia Road. The apartments consist of eight one-bedroom and eight two-bedroom units. The units are unfurnished except for a stove and refrigerator. Local telephone service, basic cable service, water, and data connections are provided as part of the rent.
