No. 3 UT Martin set for OVC tourney opener against No. 6 Murray State

MARTIN, Tenn. - The University of Tennessee at Martin softball team will put its perfect 6-0 record against Ohio Valley Conference rival Murray State on the line Thursday morning in the first game of the OVC Tournament at Williams Field on the Eastern Illinois campus. Action gets under way at 10 a.m.

The Skyhawks (32-22) wrapped up the No. 3 seed this past weekend by winning two of three games against visiting Tennessee Tech. Murray State (23-26), won two-of three against Jacksonville State and claimed the No. 6 seed in the double elimination tournament where an automatic berth in the NCAA Regional Tournament awaits the winner.

"Murray State is riding the wave right now. They are playing extremely well," UT Martin head coach Donley Canary said. "They will present a lot of challenges for us with their bats."

Murray State is hitting .283 as a team, but Lauren Buch leads the team with her .421 batting average. She has 15 homers and 54 RBI. Jenna Bradley leads the team with 18 home runs and 55 RBI. Bradley is hitting .348.

"We are not going to pitch around Bradley and Buch," Canary said. "We are going to let Amanda (Brandenburg) pitch to them. "She (Brandenburg) is riding her own wave right now and has been dominating for us."

Brandenburg will enter the tournament with a 13-3 won-loss record and a 2.32 ERA. The

true freshman from Camden has made 21 appearances this season and pitched 90.2 innings. However, she only pitched 3.2 innings against Murray State in the Skyhawks' 14-6 victory back on March 13.

Brandenburg gave up three hits, one run and two walks. She struck out four en route to her fifth victory of the season in the circle.

The Skyhawks swept the three-game series against Murray State, but the first game went 10 innings before UT Martin came away with a 6-5 victory. The Skyhawks swept the double-header on March 12 with a 3-0 win. Both teams piled up 21 hits each in the series. Bradley had two home runs in the three games.

The Skyhawks are capable of hitting the ball as well. The team enters the tournament with a .272 batting average. Brandenburg leads the team with her .353 batting average and 14 doubles. Freshman third baseman Stephanie Nidiffer is hitting .337. Sophomore Leah Taylor, a transfer from Tennessee, leads the Skyhawks with 10 home runs, seven triples and 31 stolen bases.

The Skyhawks would play No. 2 Jacksonville State at 3 p.m. Thursday if they defeated Murray State. If the Skyhawks drop their opener to Murray State they will fall to the losers' bracket and play the loser of the tournament's second game (No. 4 SIU Edwardsville and No. 5 Southeast Missouri State) at 10 a.m. Friday.

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT UT MARTIN & THE OVC TOURNAMENT ...

■ **Looking back at the 2010 Tournament**

UT Martin hosted the 2010 Tournament at Bettye Giles Field on campus and went 2-2 with wins over Eastern Illinois (3-2) and Tennessee Tech (2-1). The Skyhawks dropped a 5-4 decision to Jacksonville State and met Jax State in the title game where the Skyhawks suffered a 10-1 loss.

■ **OVC Postseason worksheets**

The Skyhawks sport a 20-25 record in the OVC Tournament and are 14-15 in the OVC postseason under the direction of head coach Donley Canary.

■ **As a No. 3 seed**

The Skyhawks are 1-6 as a No. 3 seed in the OVC Tournament.

■ **Against Murray State**

The Skyhawks are 6-0 against Murray State during the regular season all-time, but have never played the Racers in the postseason tournament. Earlier this season the Skyhawks swept the Racers at Bettye Giles Field, winning 6-5 in 10 innings; 3-0; and 14-6.

■ **Against the host school**

The Skyhawks are 1-6 against tournament host Eastern Illinois. Last year's 2-1 victory marked the first time the Skyhawks defeated the Panthers.

■ **Against this year's tournament field**

While this year's postseason tourney is the first for SIUE, the Skyhawks are a combined 10-14 in OVC tournaments against Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State and Southeast Missouri State.

■ *Looking back at the series against Tennessee Tech*

UT Martin and Tennessee Tech closed out the 2011 OVC season with three one-run games. UT Martin won two of the three games. UT Martin and Tech have played 15 one-run games since 2002, and the Skyhawks hold a 9-6 edge.

■ *Freshman makes immediate impact*

Freshman Amanda Brandenburg from Camden leads the Skyhawks with 13 multiple hit games. She has had two hits in nine games this season. Brandenburg is second on the team with 10 multiple RBI games.

■ *One away from tying single season strikeout record*

Junior pitcher Chelsea Jones has recorded 173 strikeouts this season. She has moved up to No. 4 on the Skyhawks single season strikeout list. Kendra Kosco leads the list with 192 strikeouts in 2002, while Pajj Lintz is second with 174 strikeouts in 2010.

■ *Among the nation's top 25*

Junior shortstop Jenny Bain is the 21st toughest batter in the nation to strike out, while sophomore second baseman Leah Taylor is 10th in the nation in triples hit per game (0.14) and 4th in the nation with seven triples this season.

■ *Home runs per game*

The Skyhawks are ranked 73rd in the nation in home runs hit per game (0.8). Florida is No. 1 in the nation with 1.96 home runs per game.

■ *Double-digit runs*

The Skyhawks have scored 11 or more runs five times this season and are 5-0 when they score double-digits. The Skyhawks recorded an 11-0 victory over Belmont Tuesday, April 19. The victory marked the third time this season the Skyhawks have scored 11 runs in a game. The most runs the Skyhawks have scored in a single game this season was 14 against Murray State on March 13.

■ *Canary racks up seventh 30-plus win season at UT Martin*

Head coach Donley Canary and the Skyhawks won 32 games this season. Canary has had seven 30-plus win seasons in his 10 years as the UT Martin head coach.

■ *Among the top three teams five of past 10 years*

By clinching third place this season, Canary and the Skyhawks have finished among the top three in the OVC five out of the past 10 years.

PRESS AREA SERVICES

The press area is located in the Bettye Giles Field Press Box. Media information including game notes, media guides and game day score cards will be available in this area. Upon request phone lines can be made available.

STATISTICAL SERVICES

Services provided include statistics generated from the STATCREW computer statistics program.

PHOTOGRAPHER CREDENTIALS

Credentials will be issued only to accredited photographers or those individuals on special assignment. Credentials should be requested at in advance from Joe Lofaro in the UT Martin Sports Information office. Work areas include areas along both the first and third base foul lines, beyond the bases. Photographers are also allowed to shoot from any area outside the fence that does not interfere with play of the game.

HEAD COACH DONLEY CANARY (32-22, 10TH SEASON)

Donley Canary has been head softball coach at UT Martin for nine seasons. During that time he has not only become the programs all-time winningest coach, but also transformed the Skyhawk softball team into a very respected and perennial Ohio Valley Conference power along with guiding the program to its first-ever OVC



Tournament title and NCAA Tournament berth in 2009 and its first OVC regular season championship in 2010.

After nine seasons, Canary sports a 297-223-1 won-loss-tie record and his teams have advanced to the OVC tournament as the No.

1 seed this past season, No. 3 seed twice, and No. 4 seed three times, plus once as a No. 2 and No. 5 seed. Canary has coached 56 All-OVC selections in his nine seasons. Sixteen of those have been named to the All-OVC First Team, 16 were named All-OVC Second Team, three were All-OVC Honorable Mentions along with 15 named to the OVC All-Tournament Team, including one OVC Tournament MVP. Canary has also had 12 OVC All-Newcomer team members which was newly created for the 2006 season.

Canary is currently the fourth all-time winningest coach in the Ohio Valley Conference with 297 career wins and is fourth winningest among active coaches in the conference. Of the active coaches on the all-time winningest list, Canary is the only one who has been at the helm of his team for less than 10 seasons.

Canary's teams have also excelled in the classroom, earning the OVC Academic Award in 2005 along with currently being the team that owns the highest grade point average over the last five years according to the National Fast pitch Coaches Association.

Canary came to UT Martin from Tennessee Tech where he held various positions in athletics since 1993. He served as director of athletic fund-raising and assistant softball coach during the 2000-01 seasons, amassing a 44-20 record. Canary also served as an assistant baseball coach for the Golden Eagles from 1993 -2000 season. During that time Tech claimed a 193-235-1 record highlighted by a regular season and tournament Ohio Valley Conference championship in 1997.

Canary is a former Academic All-American baseball player from 1973-77 and graduate of Tennessee Tech University. He was inducted into the Tennessee Tech Sports Hall of Fame in 1997 in recognition of his outstanding playing career.

An All-OVC outfielder, Canary led the Golden Eagles with a .429 batting average and was named All-South and received the Academic All-American award following the 1976 season. Canary was the top batter in the Golden Eagle line up during the 1974 and 1976 seasons. In 1974, he led Tech with a .327 average at the plate and 1976 average of .429 still sits as third all-time in Golden Eagle baseball history.

Canary also sits at fourth in walks with 39 and sixth in at-bats per strikeout with 27.2. On the career walks

list, Canary still holds the top spot with 134 free passes during his tenure.

He earned his master's degree from the University of Tennessee in 1980. Canary and his wife, Jenny (also a Tennessee Tech graduate), have one son, David who is currently an assistant coach at Johnson County Community College in Overland Park, Kansas. Jenny currently works in Skyhawk Athletics as the department's ticket manager.

UT Martin and Eastern Kentucky have played 32 times since UT Martin head coach Donley Canary has been coaching the Skyhawks. Canary is 16-16 against the Lady Colonels. The two teams played a doubleheader March 26 and split the twinbill. The two squads were scheduled to play a three-game series, but the third game was cancelled because of inclement weather.

■ UT Martin vs. the Southeastern Conference

UT Martin has played four teams in the Southeastern Conference - Georgia, Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Tennessee - and sports a 1-9 won-loss record against the four teams. The lone win against an SEC school was against Ole Miss in 2010. The Skyhawks claimed a 7-6 victory in nine innings over the Rebels in the Georgia Tech Buzz Classic.

■ Stolen bases by the half dozen

The Skyhawks stole six bases against Southeast Missouri State Wednesday, March 30, in the second game of the doubleheader. The Skyhawks have stolen six bases in a single game one other time this season and that was against IUPUI in the Frost Classic in Chattanooga.

■ Old foe from Gulf South, still rival in Ohio Valley

UT Martin and Jacksonville State used to compete as members of the Gulf South Conference. The two teams played nine times as members of the GSC and Jacksonville State led that series 6-3. In 2004, the two teams renewed their rivalry in the Ohio Valley Conference. UT Martin took 2-of-3 games this season at Bettye Giles Field in Skyhawk Park. Overall Jacksonville State leads the series, 28-10. The series started in 1992.
