UTM Quick Hitters

- UTM is coming off an 82-76 victory over No. 1 Tennessee Tech in the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament Championship. Playing as the No. 2 seed, the Skyhawks took control late in the first half and led for the last 25 minutes of the game to earn their first-ever NCAA Tournament berth.
- Freshman Jasmine Newsome earned All-OVC Tournament Most Valuable Player honors, scoring 44 points in two games. After sharing the league's Defensive Player of the Year award, she became the first freshman to ever capture OVC Tournament MVP honors.
- Freshman Heather Butler joined Newsome on the All-OVC Tournament team. Butler, who was named The OVC Freshman of the Year, scored 21 points in both tournament games.
- With nine freshmen and three newcomers, UT Martin is the youngest team in the country. Butler is the nation's leading freshman scorer at 19.1 points per game. Newsome is the third leading freshman scorer with 17.8 points per game. Both players were named to the OVC first team and Newcomer squad.

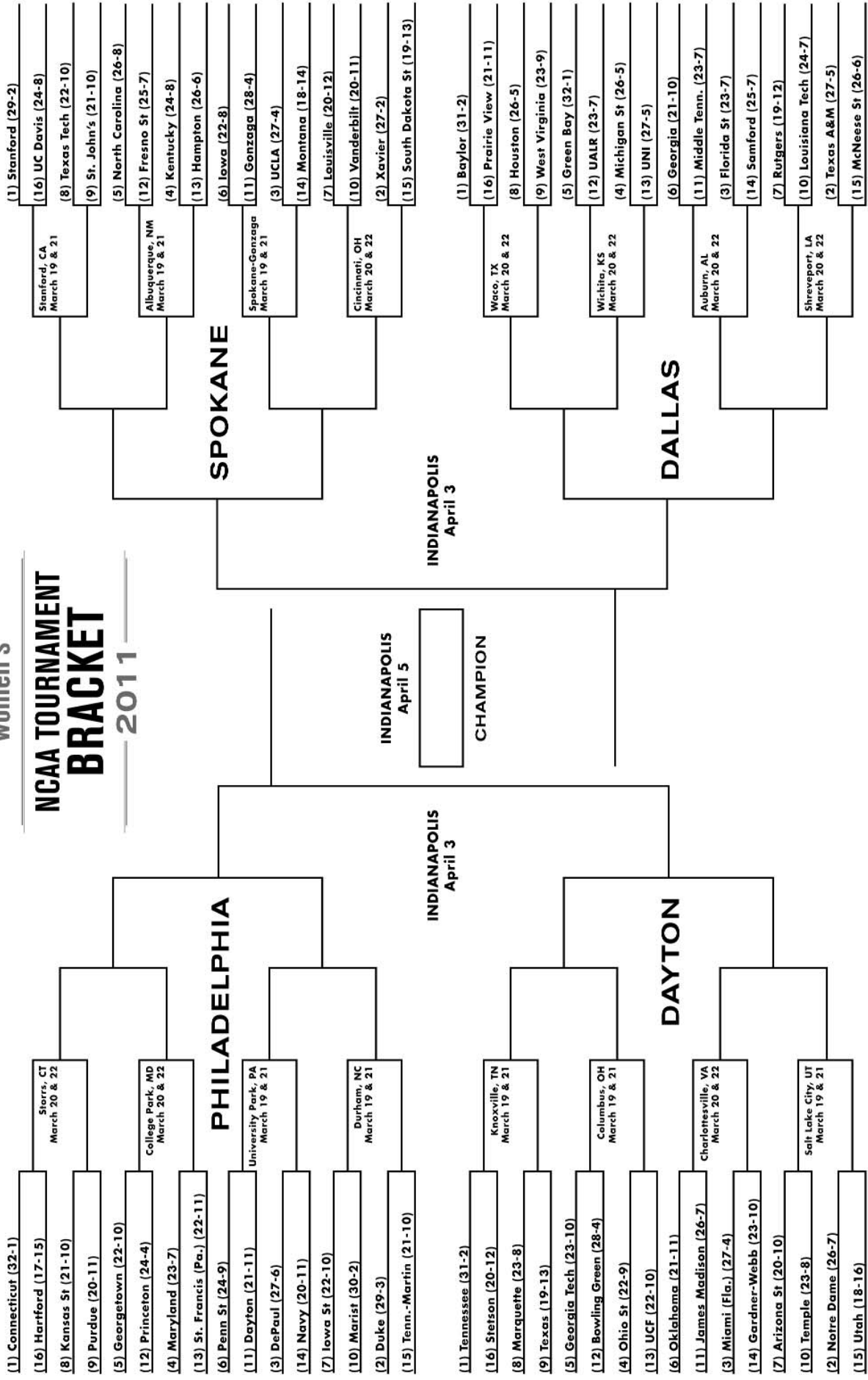

Coach Kevin McMillan's Comments (Tuesday morning after the selection show)

Opening statement:

"We're excited that we're staying in the South. Duke has a great tradition and their coach has won a national championship. They have an All-American in Jasmine Thomas. This is the type of matchup that you love for this time of year. We have a young team but we won't get too starry-eyed playing at Cameron. We are looking forward to the experience - this is a great building block for our program."

On how the tough early season schedule prepared the team for a moment like this:

"When we put our schedule together, we knew that if our kids had a chance to make it to the NCAA Tournament, we had to put together a schedule that would teach them how to play at that level. Ten games on the road to start the season is crazy in itself, then you throw in teams such as Louisville, Kentucky and Vanderbilt and they are all in the NCAA Tournament. When we line up to get ready to play Duke, our players will have played that type of team and they will know the level they will have to compete at. They know what's in front of them."

On what he knows about Duke at this point:

"I've watched Duke a couple times this year. There are not any great matchups when you're talking about an ACC champion against the OVC champion. With Duke, there are no weaknesses to exploit. Duke likes to pressure some and I think with our guards Heather Butler and Jasmine Newsome - we have seen that before. I feel ok that we can compete in the backcourt. What scares you to death about Duke is they have 6-4, 6-5 players they bring off the bench. If you look at their roster, every player averages double-figure minutes. They try to wear you down and we don't have that kind of depth. Jasmine Thomas is an All-American and she is probably 5-10 and can rebound with any post players in the country. But we are a little unorthodox, so we are hoping to put Duke back on its heels."

On how Duke's size will affect the game plan:

"We have played against size - Indiana State was really big. Their inside kid had career-highs in points and rebounds against us so size is a major factor. The difference in size at that level is that when those players switch on screens and guard you, she feels pretty confident she can keep our guards in front of them. We like to take advantage of teams switching so we can put our guards on bigger kids but Duke is athletic enough to keep us in front of them. We will have to do things different to take advantage of that."

On how the youngest team in the nation made it to this point:

"We thought that there was enough talent with this team to have a chance at the NCAA Tournament. Where you fall short is to think that this many newcomers and freshman can get us there. You have to put yourself in position to get a high seed in your conference tournament and then win it because the OVC won't get an at-large bid. It was a stretch to say we would get to the NCAA Tournament because we're relying on six to seven freshmen. We saw where on the Selection Show last night they did a feature on freshmen point guards leading their teams. Well, we have a freshman point guard leading a lineup that includes three freshmen and a junior or a senior, or even four other freshmen. There's a difference in that. That's a tribute to the talent level of these kids and figuring out what we have to do to be successful. We are a very selfless team. To put it in perspective, Duke has Jasmine Thomas who has three years of collegiate experience coming in to this year. Their point guard has more experience than our entire team. UT Martin has such a rich tradition in women's athletics with Pat Head Summit, Lin Dunn, Nadine Gearin and Bettye Giles. We are just pleased, humbled and fortunate to represent UT Martin and to be a part of that legacy."

On his thoughts on the fan support at last night's Selection Show party:

"I thought the show was really neat, watching at Watkins Auditorium on Spring Break and it was basically full. To think that we have that many fans is humbling and it is very neat for our kids to see that kind of support when we have never done anything in the NCAA Tournament. West Tennessee and UT Martin is such a special place because of the support you get from the university and community. We are one big family. People I know from way back were at the event last night, as were a lot of the players' families. The reactions were great. When a No. 1 seed popped up and we didn't get them, that got just as big of an ovation for that than when our name finally appeared. When Duke popped up, we realized what the committee had done and that did not bode well for us. Once they got down to about the 13 seed, they started jumbling them and throwing them in to geographical regions which was not a good thing because there was nothing near us. We had a higher RPI than some teams that had higher seeds. But to play Duke is a tribute to our program. Duke thinks they are going to win the national championship but to get there they have to play UT Martin first. That says a lot about how far we have come to get here."

On how team will adjust to playing in the biggest game of their careers:

"We're going to prepare just like we do for every game. This morning I was going back trying to find teams we have played that are somewhat like Duke and how we attacked them. Kentucky and Louisville are that caliber of team - those are the two most similar games we have to work from. How that's going to translate to the kids and the floor, I have no idea. But I also had no idea going into the Morehead State game in the last game of the regular season with the No. 2 seed on the line. I didn't know when we played Morehead State in the first OVC Tournament game and I didn't know playing against Tennessee Tech in the OVC Tournament championship. We go into every single game thinking the kids will be shell-shocked and we are prepared to help them through that. We may have to use a timeout early to help calm down, but then again I didn't have to do that in the OVC Tournament so we'll see."

On the team's strengths heading into the NCAA Tournament:

"If we can control our two guards, we feel comfortable with our game plan. Heather Butler and Jasmine Newsome are two of the top freshmen scorers in the country. They are little but if you look at what they did against bigger teams, you have to respect that. If you can control those guards, you can control us. We shoot three-pointers well - we are the No. 2 team in the nation in three-pointers made. We are hoping to have a big night so they can help stretch out the floor for our guards. Without question we will be leaning on our perimeter shooting and guard play."

On team's health entering the NCAA Tournament:

"Allison Wright tore her other ACL in practice last week. She tore her other ACL last year five games into the season and was out for year. Besides that, everybody is healthy except for a few nagging injuries. I don't like the weather change, normally when that happens that means sickness creeps in. But we are relatively healthy heading into the weekend."

On team's travel information:

"We will find out this afternoon - the NCAA will let us know exactly our travel information. We are crossing our fingers on a charter flight out of Paducah (Ky.). We are hoping to leave Thursday around 10 o'clock, flying out to Durham. That would put us there about 48 hours before the game and that will help us get settled before the craziness sets in on Friday with the press conference and practice."

Notes

One of three -- UT Martin is one of three first-time teams in this year's NCAA Tournament. The other two teams are Samford and Navy. Samford, now a member of the Southern Conference, and UT Martin used to compete as members of the Ohio Valley Conference.

First meeting, but not first trip -- This will be the first meeting between UT Martin and Duke, but this is not UT Martin's first trip to Cameron Indoor Stadium. The UT Martin men played at Duke Nov. 20, 2004. The Blue Devils posted a convincing 88-46 victory.

On the national stage -- The last time UT Martin competed in a national tournament was in 1999 when the team played two games in the WNIT. UT Martin claimed a 77-66 victory over visiting Ole Miss in the first round, but suffered an 87-73 setback at the University of Memphis.

Moving up -- UT Martin competed as a member of the NCAA Division II before moving up to Division I in 1992 and joining the Ohio Valley Conference. UT Martin was a member of Division II's Gulf South Conference from 1970 through 1990.

In the beginning -- UT Martin's first year of college basketball was 1969. The team was coached by the late Nadine Gearin and finished the season with an 8-2 record. The team's first trip to post-season play was in 1971 when it advanced to and won the AIAW State Tournament.

AIAW National Tourney -- UT Martin played in its first national tournament in 1972 when Coach Nadine Gearin led the team to a 20-8 record. The team won the AIAW district championship, regional championship and competed in the national tournament. UT Martin went 1-1 in the national tournament played at Normal, Ill. UT Martin defeated Long Beach State 53-43, and then lost to Mississippi University of Women.

The first coach -- Nadine Gearin, UT Martin's first women's basketball head coach was 105-86 from 1969-78. Coach Gearin's most notable player was Pat Head (Summitt) who played at UT Martin from 1970-74.

Coach Summitt as a player -- Pat Head Summitt was UT Martin's first 1,000-point scorer. She finished her career with 1,405 points and was a member of the 1972-73 team that compiled a 22-3 record and advanced to the AIAW National Tournament.

Named in honor -- UT Martin's Skyhawks play in the Kathleen and Tom Elam Center on campus. When the venue is set up for basketball, it is commonly called Skyhawk Arena and the teams play on Pat Head Summitt Court. The court was named in honor of Summitt on Nov. 23, 1997.

WNBA connection -- Athletics Hall of Fame member Lin Dunn never played collegiate basketball at UT Martin, but she played a vital role in the beginning of the program. The only problem was that by the time UT Martin had a team, Dunn already graduated. From her experiences and love for the game of basketball, Dunn moved on to become one of the nation's best collegiate head coaches, compiling a 447-257 record at Austin Peay, Ole Miss, Miami and Purdue. She went on to become a successful head coach in the WNBA, directing the Indiana Fever to a 2009 Eastern Conference championship. She was inducted to the UT Martin Athletics Hall of Fame in October of 2010.

Youngest team in the nation -- For the second consecutive season, UT Martin head coach Kevin McMillan has put the youngest team in all of NCAA Division I on the floor. McMillan entered his first season at the helm with just four years of Division-I experience. With the addition of 12 newcomers (nine freshmen and three junior college transfers) this season, the number of experienced years went down to two, as senior Alecia Weatherly and redshirt sophomore Allison Wright each had logged one season in Division-I.

West Tennessee coaching connection -- After beginning his playing career at Atlantic Coast Conference member Wake Forest, McMillan finished up at Rhodes College in Memphis. Since that point, McMillan has coached girls' basketball at Millington Central High School, Westview High School in Martin and Gibson County High School in Dyer before accepting the job at UT Martin in 2009. His wife Paige even attended Lambuth University in Jackson - located just 50 miles away from the UT Martin campus.

The rest of the coaching staff has unique ties to each other. McMillan's first hire as an assistant coach at UT Martin was Brian Haskins, the previous head boys' basketball coach at Westview. A West Tennessee native himself (growing up in Camden), Haskins had also served as a women's basketball assistant coach at his alma mater Lambuth before taking over the Westview boys program. Also joining McMillan's first staff as a graduate assistant was Heather Scruggs, who was coming off a successful playing career at Lambuth and Gibson County High School. At

Gibson County, she prepped under legendary coach David Russell, who amassed 951 victories as a girls' high school head coach that also included a stop at Bradford High School just up the road from Martin. While McMillan was in his first season at UT Martin, Russell took over the reigns of McMillan's defending 36-0 state champion Gibson County program in 2009-10. Less than two months after guiding the Lady Pioneers to a 35-1 record and another Class AA state championship, Russell joined the Skyhawks as a part-time assistant. The Russell hiring was one of two changes in the Skyhawk coaching staff last summer. Stacie Evans, a UT Martin graduate who played her senior season at Westview under McMillan in 1998, also joined the Skyhawk bench as a part-time assistant. A Martin native, Evans had previously been UT Martin's academic support services coordinator in the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics.

Local players -- Not only does each and every coach on staff have ties to the West Tennessee area, a half-dozen players on the roster call West Tennessee "home." Grace Ann Swaim resides in Martin and went to Westview. Heather Butler and Aubrey Reedy played under both McMillan and Russell at Gibson County. Perica Glenn attended Milan High School just 30 miles away from the UT Martin campus. Jasmine Newsome and Matrikia Minter attended Millington Central and Bolivar Central High School, respectively. Both Newsome and Minter are about 120 miles from home at UT Martin.

UT Martin makes 12th trip to OVC Tourney

The Skyhawk women will make their 12th appearance in the Ohio Valley Conference Tournament since joining the league in 1992. The Skyhawks earned the No. 2 seed in the tournament by going 14-4 during the regular season. All four losses - at Morehead State, at Tennessee Tech, at Austin Peay and at Eastern Illinois - were on the road and one of the four setbacks was an overtime decision. The 14 victories in the league are the most for the Skyhawks in a single season since 1998.

The irony behind the success is the Skyhawks opened the season with 13 newcomers and nine true freshman. Combined with senior Alecia Weatherly the Skyhawks were and still are the youngest team in the nation. Second-year head coach Kevin McMillan acknowledges his team's youth, but does not use it as an excuse.

To make things just a little tougher, the Skyhawks opened the season with a 10-game road trip that included stops in six states against two SEC teams, a Big East contender and two Big 12 schools.

UT Martin freshmen haul in OVC honors

Heather Butler and Jasmine Newsome piled up some impressive accolades as freshman basketball players at The University of Tennessee at Martin. The two Skyhawk guards have been recognized as Freshman of the Week five times each. Both players have also been recognized as the league's Player and Freshman of the Week in the same week.

However, those weekly honors are pale in comparison to the latest hardware for Butler, from Medina, and Newsome, from Millington.

Butler, who prepped at Gibson County High School, was named the Ohio Valley Conference's Freshman of the Year. Newsome, from Millington, was named the league's Co-Defensive Player of the Year. Butler and Newsome were also named to the All-OVC first team and the OVC's All-Newcomer team.

Butler is averaging 19 points, 3.8 assists and 2.9 rebounds per game. She shoots 40 percent from the field and 36 percent from 3-point range. Earlier this year, Butler broke the UT Martin school record for most 3-pointers made in a season when she netted four treys against Southeast Missouri State. She enters the OVC Tournament having made 81-of-223 three-pointers.

Butler is the nation's leading freshman scorer and is 21st overall in scoring. She is also ranked 13th in the nation for 3-point field goals made per game (2.9).

Newsome averages 17.6 points, 4.2 rebounds and 4.1 assists per game. She shoots 41 percent from the field, 36 percent from 3-point range and 75 percent from the free throw line. Newsome leads the team in steals with 65 and at 5-foot-7-inches tall she has seven blocks to her credit.

Newsome is the nation's third leading freshman scorer and the 51st leading scorer in the nation.

UT Martin vs. Morehead State

UT Martin split with Morehead State during the regular season. The two teams opened the OVC slate, Dec. 12, 2010 at Morehead State. The Lady Eagles won, 103-82, on their home court. The two teams also closed out the season Saturday, Feb. 26, in Martin. The Skyhawks claimed an 88-69 victory. In both games each team relied on one player. UT Martin's Jasmine Newsome scored 33 points, while Morehead State's Chynna Bozeman netted 32 points.

UT Martin vs. Jacksonville State

UT Martin swept Jacksonville State this season. The Skyhawks were forced to come-from-behind to beat the Gamecocks on their home court, 74-67. The game at Martin was lopsided as the Skyhawks posted a 91-60 victory. The Skyhawks made 11 three-pointers in the home win and only two at Jacksonville State. Newsome scored 18 points at Jacksonville State and 30 points in Skyhawk Arena against the Gamecocks.

UT Martin vs. Tennessee State

UT Martin defeated Tennessee State twice this season. The Skyhawks had a battle in Martin before claiming an 83-67 win. The Skyhawks also won in Nashville, 70-64. It was the first win over TSU in the Gentry Center since 2006.

Head Coach Kevin McMillan (32-29, 22-14 OVC) 2nd Season

Kevin McMillan said the best thing about his first season as the head coach at The University of Tennessee at Martin "was seeing the players who bought into his system reap the rewards from sacrificing and believing."

Now McMillan, the eighth head coach in UT Martin women's basketball history, is confronted with a tougher challenge - enduring one of the toughest regular season schedules in school history and getting back to the Ohio Valley Conference tournament in Nashville. "I am looking forward to this season," McMillan said. "We are young, but I am anxious to watch these kids compete."

"Last year's team reaffirmed that if you continuously do things the right way, you will be rewarded," McMillan said.

The Skyhawks finished the season with an 11-19 overall record and an 8-10 mark in the OVC. The No. 4-seeded Skyhawks advanced to the OVC tournament semifinals after knocking off No. 5 Eastern Kentucky 51-47 in Skyhawk Arena. The season came to an end in the tournament semifinals when the Skyhawks ran out of gas against No. 1 Eastern Illinois, losing 65-51. McMillan was named OVC Coach of the Year, while junior Alecia Weatherly and freshman LaBrica Ward were named to the OVC All-Newcomer team.

The much improved OVC just adds to the challenge for the Skyhawks this season, but McMillan's background has prepared him to lead the upstart team in the right direction.

Before UT Martin, McMillan spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Middle Tennessee State, and he has 17 years experience as a high school head coach. He sports an overall record of 484-135 and most recently (2008-09) led Gibson County High School to an undefeated 35-0 season and a Tennessee state championship.

At Middle Tennessee, McMillan was the head assistant in charge of recruiting and on-floor coaching. As a recruiter he put together one of the top 10 recruiting classes in the nation according to Blue Star Scouting Services in 2005, while also bringing in a junior college All-American and the 2007 Sun Belt Conference Newcomer of the Year. His recruiting classes helped Middle Tennessee claim back-to-back Sun Belt championships in 2006 and 2007, along with a pair of berths in the NCAA Tournament. In the 2006-07 season, Middle Tennessee recorded a nation's best and a school record 27 consecutive wins and became the first team in Sun Belt history to go through the conference schedule with a record of 18-0, while also defeating No. 8 Georgia and achieving a rank of No. 16 in the AP Top 25.

As a floor coach, McMillan was responsible for the offensive and defensive game plans and implementation. During his tenure, Middle Tennessee had the top turnover margin in the country (+16), while the offense was No. 1 in the country for 3-pointers per game (9.2) and No. 4 in the nation in scoring per game (81.6). While McMillan was on the sidelines at Middle Tennessee, the Blue Raiders achieved a record of 50-15 overall.

In the high school ranks, McMillan has proven himself as one of the most successful women's head coaches in Tennessee. In his 17 years as a head coach he amassed a record of 435-126, while winning one state title and making six trips to the state tournament. McMillan's teams have also captured 17 district, region and sub-state championships, earning him numerous coaching accolades. He has twice been named the Jackson Sun's West Tennessee Coach of the Year, in 2009 and 2003, and the district coach of the year 10 times.

McMillan's most recent stint was at Gibson County High School from 2007-09. During his tenure, he led Gibson County to a record of 62-6, including a pair of state tournament berths and an undefeated 35-0 run to the 2009 state championship. In his two-year tenure he was named district coach of the year in both 2008 and 2009, as his teams won a pair of region and sub-state tournaments along with a district crown in 2009.

Before jumping to the collegiate ranks as an assistant at Middle Tennessee, McMillan spent eight years as the head coach at Westview High School in Martin where he compiled a record of 195-67 and reached the state tournament in 2001, 2003 and 2005. His Charger teams won the sub-state championship five times, while he was named the district coach of the year in 2001, 2003 and 2005. The 2003 season earned McMillan his first West Tennessee Coach of the Year honor after leading Westview to the championship game of the Tennessee state tournament.

From 1990-97, McMillan was the head coach at Millington High School, amassing a record of 177-47. He led Millington to five consecutive district championships from 1993-97 along with a pair of sub-state titles in 1994 and 1997. His 1994 squad qualified for the Tennessee state tournament and advanced to the quarterfinal round.

McMillan played basketball at Wake Forest for one season, 1985, before transferring to Rhodes College to finish out his career from 1986-89. At Rhodes he was a three-time all-conference selection and in 1988 was named the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference Player of the Year. In only three seasons, McMillan scored 1,372 career points and still ranks ninth all-time at Rhodes for career-points scored.

McMillan received his B.A. in math and business in 1989 from Rhodes; then completed his master's in health and human performance at Middle Tennessee in 2007. He and his wife Paige have two sons, Matt (10) and Ben (8), along with one daughter, Alli (1).

■ Skyhawks gain more than wins on Canadian tour

If you go by the scoreboard, The University of Tennessee at Martin women's basketball team suffered a disappointing 75-55 loss to host Western Ontario Saturday afternoon to wrap up its 10-day, five-game Canadian tour.

If you are head coach Kevin McMillan, a member of his coaching staff or a Skyhawk player you are grateful for the Canadian tour, pleased with the 4-1 work-sheet, and OK with the loss to Western Ontario. You also knew before you left Martin that going to Canada for five games was not about the scoreboard results.

"We finished off a great Canadian trip and have learned a lot about our team," McMillan said. "We played three or four different ways during the trip and are beginning to formulate the type of team we will need to be. Spending the past three weeks together has been invaluable to us," McMillan said.

"Not only the basketball side, but also getting to spend this time to get to know each other. We are fortunate to have had this experience and thankful to the university (UT Martin) for the opportunity."

■ Non-conference schedule loaded with challenges

The University of Tennessee at Martin women's basketball team will play 12 non-conference games this season against teams such as Southern Illinois Carbondale, Colorado, Air Force, Missouri, Vanderbilt, Evansville, Indiana State, Louisville and Kentucky.

"I believe the only way to find out how good you are or how good you can be is to go out and play the best," the Skyhawks second-year head coach Kevin McMillan said.

"We have two schools on our schedule who spent the majority of this past season in the top 25 in the nation," McMillan said.

The non-conference schedule includes Southeastern Conference foes Vanderbilt and Kentucky, both opponents that the Skyhawks have played in the past.

"Both Kentucky and Vanderbilt are going to be at the top of the SEC and among the top teams in the nation," McMillan said.

"If two SEC foes are not enough for us, we will also play Missouri and Colorado who come from the nation's toughest conference last year, the Big 12," McMillan said.

"Throw in the remainder of the non-conference schedule and we will definitely know what this young team is made of by January," McMillan said. "We feel this will allow us to strive to be the best team we can be and represent the university proudly any and everywhere we play."

The Skyhawks will play three Ohio Valley Conference games in December, two on the road against Morehead State and Eastern Kentucky and one at home against Murray State on Wednesday, Dec. 22. The remainder of the OVC slate gets under way in January. The Skyhawk women will host Austin Peay at 7 p.m., Thursday, Jan. 6.

■ OVC unveils new playing surface for tournament

At its annual Basketball Media Day event, the Ohio Valley Conference and Nashville Municipal Auditorium publicly unveiled the brand new playing surface for the OVC Basketball Tournament.

As part of the deal to host the tournament at the venue, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements that will be completed prior to this year's championship are upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface.

The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring (<http://www.hornerflooring.com>), whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. The Horner Pro King portable floor at Municipal Auditorium was purchased for a cost of \$71,960; the court will be used for the OVC Tournament, various high school games/tournaments and special events such as the Harlem Globetrotters.

"The Nashville Municipal Auditorium is excited about the opportunity to be home court for the OVC basketball tournament during the next four years," said Bob Skoney, general manager of Nashville Municipal Auditorium. "Mayor Karl Dean and the Metropolitan Council members have expressed their appreciation of this event in downtown Nashville by approving funds that will allow for these improvements."

■ Freshmen start first four games of 2010-11

Head coach Kevin McMillan opted to start five true freshmen in the first four games of the season against Southern Illinois University Carbondale, Indiana State, Belmont and Colorado.

The starting lineup for all four games featured - Beth Hawn, Aubrey Reedy, Heather Butler, Jasmine Newsome and Jaclyssa Haislip.

■ Iron women play 39 minutes against Colorado

Freshmen Heather Butler and Jaclyssa Haislip played 39 of 40 minutes each against Big 12 member Colorado on Nov. 21. Butler led all Skyhawk scorers with 18 points while Haislip netted 17 points and pulled down 10 rebounds.

■ Back-to-back double-doubles

Freshmen Jaclyssa Haislip recorded her fourth double-double of the season Thursday, Feb. 17 at Eastern Illinois where she scored 25 points and grabbed 12 rebounds.

The Skyhawks have had six double-doubles this season. Haislip has four of the six, while freshman Beth Hawn and sophomore Rickiesha Bryant have one each.

Before this season, the last time UT Martin played in the state of Colorado was Dec. 21, 2004 when the Skyhawks played at Colorado State University in Colorado Springs. The Skyhawks suffered a 95-49 setback.

■ OVC opens not kind to Skyhawks

UT Martin suffered a 103-82 loss at Morehead State on Thursday, Dec. 2, 2010. The loss marked the 15th time UT Martin has suffered a loss in an Ohio Valley Conference opener. The Skyhawks are now 4-15 in OVC openers since joining the league in 1992-93. The last time the Skyhawks opened the OVC portion of their schedule with a victory was during the 2002-03 season when they knocked off Eastern Kentucky 82-70.

■ High scoring games

The Skyhawks scored more than 80 points in back-to-back games at Air Force and at Morehead State and were 1-1 in those two games. The Skyhawks claimed a 91-87 victory over Air Force and lost to Morehead State 103-82. UT Martin: Superlatives and Fast Facts

About UT Martin

■The University of Tennessee at Martin was founded in 1900 as Hall-Moody Institute.

■A record 8,469 students enrolled for fall semester 2010 at UT Martin. The fall 2010 total included all-time record fall enrollments for total headcount, undergraduates, dual-enrollment students, transfer students, total credit hours and total full-time equivalent.

■UT Martin's student headcount has increased 44% from fall 2001 to fall 2010.

■The average high school GPAs of first-time UT Martin freshmen increased from fall 2009 to fall 2010.

■UT Martin's graduation rate rose from 36.1% in 2001 to 45.2% in 2010 for a 29.4% increase in 10 years.

■UT Martin is home to UT Online, the University of Tennessee's online programs for both undergraduate and graduate degrees. UT Online enrollment at Martin grew 29.7% from 2009 to 2010.

■After recent completion of more than \$20 million in capital and maintenance projects, almost \$24 million in additional capital improvement projects are under way or set to begin at UT Martin, including projects through 2012. Among new projects, the Fine Arts Building will be renovated and more than 52,000 square feet of new construction added to the facility at a cost of \$14 million.

Recognitions and Superlatives

■UT Martin is listed as a top-tier university among southern, master's level institutions in the 2011 edition of America's Best Colleges compiled by U.S. News & World Report.

■UT Martin's Tennessee Intercollegiate State Legislature delegation was voted "Best House Delegation" in November 2010 at the 41st General Assembly of the group in Nashville. Approximately 200 students represented 37 Tennessee colleges and universities at the event. Allison Jones, of South Fulton, was the UT Martin lead delegate.

■The Princeton Review lists UT Martin as "A Best Southeastern College" for 2011.

■For the fifth consecutive year, Institutional Research & Evaluation Inc. lists UT Martin among "America's 100 Best College Buys."

■The Carnegie Foundation has selected UT Martin for the 2010 Community Engagement Classification. The university is one of 115 institutions added to the Community Engagement Classification, bringing the national total to 311 colleges and universities.

■UT Martin is the safest college campus in Tennessee among four-year public institutions based on crime statistics released by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation.

Academics

■More than 95% of UT Martin's graduates find jobs or are accepted to graduate schools within six months of graduation.

■UT Martin is home to two Tennessee Governor's Schools: the Tennessee Governor's School for the Humanities and the Tennessee Governor's School for the Agricultural Sciences.

■One of the largest dual-enrollment programs among Tennessee universities is based out of the UT Martin Jackson Center. The number of dual-enrollment students grew from 928 students in fall 2009 to 1,040 students in fall 2010, a 12.1% increase.

■UT Martin offers a meteorology concentration, the first program of its kind in Tennessee.

■UT Martin serves as the executive center of the Southern Consortium of the American Democracy Project (ADP-South).

Student Success

■The UT Martin Student Members of the American Chemical Society chapter leads the nation for the number of outstanding ratings (30) and Green Chapter designations (9).

■WUTM-FM was named 2010 "Best College Radio Station in the South" during the 2011 Southeast Journalism Conference at Troy University.

Student Access

■UT Martin has center locations in Jackson, Parsons, Ripley and Selmer.

■UT Online continues to answer the demand for online courses and degree programs, including an online master's degree in family and consumer sciences; an online concentration in education (teaching/non-licensure); an online bachelor's of business administration in management; and an online bachelor's degree in agricultural business.

Leadership & Economic Development

■UT Martin is home to the WestStar Leadership Program, Tennessee's first and largest regional leadership program. WestStar boasts 587 graduates and is in its 22nd year of developing the region's leaders.

■UT Martin brings at least \$138.5 million annually in income to the state of Tennessee and supports more than 3,800 jobs, according to a study released in May 2010 by UT Knoxville's Center for Business and Economic Research. The study also found that the university generates an estimated \$15.1 million in state and local tax revenue each year.

■The university's Regional Entrepreneurship and Economic Development (REED) Center provides consulting services for existing and prospective entrepreneurs and supports economic development in rural Northwest Tennessee.

Athletics

■UT Martin is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association's (NCAA) Division I and the Ohio Valley Conference.

■The Skyhawk soccer team claimed its first-ever share of a regular-season Ohio Valley Conference championship in fall 2009.

■The Skyhawk softball team claimed its first Ohio Valley Conference tournament championship in 2009 and made its first-ever appearance in the NCAA softball tournament. The team earned its first regular-season OVC championship in spring 2010, and head coach Donley Canary was named 2010 OVC Coach of the Year.

■UT Martin has the only collegiate rodeo team in Tennessee. The women's rodeo team captured the Ozark Region title in spring 2010, while the men finished second. Both teams advanced in June to the College National Finals Rodeo, where Jeff Askey won the bull-riding national championship.

Individual Accolades

■Twenty-six UT Martin students, faculty and staff members have received Love Community Service Awards, more than any other college or university in Tennessee. The Tennessee Higher Education Commission sponsors the community service recognition program.

■Dr. Lionel Crews, associate professor of physics, received the Ptero Award from the Tennessee Earth Science Teachers for his contributions to the teaching of earth science in Tennessee.

■Dr. Janet Wilbert, assistant professor of health and human performance and athletic training coordinator, received the Jerry Robertson Educator Award from the Tennessee Athletic Trainers' Society (TATS).

■Tomi Parrish, instructor of communications and adviser to both The Pacer student newspaper and The Spirit magazine, was named president of the Southeast Journalism Conference for 2012, when the event will be hosted on the UT Martin campus.

■Rachel Stephens, a senior communications major from Mt. Juliet, Tenn., won 2nd place from among more than 120 entries in the radio category of the 2010 Freedom of Speech PSA Competition, sponsored by the National Association of Broadcasters Education Foundation and the Broadcast Education Association.
