Tennessee Professional Licensure for Counselors

To qualify for the Tennessee Professional Counselor License, students are required to complete sixty (60) graduate credit hours in counseling and must pass the state board exam for counselors (see below for more information). Students who desire to complete the requirements for licensure must complete the course work for the Master of Science in Education with a major in Counseling (48 hours); then select four courses (12 credit hours) from the following selections:

- Three letters of recommendation from school superintendents, principals, teachers, professors and/or employers. Each letter must provide clear evidence that addresses the candidate's counseling skills and/or potential which will enable the individual to become a counselor.
- A two-page typed essay that fully describes the candidate's skills and experiences relevant to becoming a successful counselor. The candidate must also discuss the perceived personal abilities and attributes that will enable the counseling candidate to become a successful counselor.
- A resume. The resume needs to fully describe the candidate's degrees, and importantly, the person's occupational experiences – particularly any counseling experiences obtained.
