1		I have thoroughly enjoyed every class I have taken. The teachers have been very knowledgeable and professional. I know this was the first time for the MRP class to be online, but for future classes, more organization and timely feedback would certainly help. Other than that, I have no complaints! Thanks for all everyone has done to make this goal in my life possible.
2		This experience has been challenging yet rewarding. My only suggestion would be that all fields of study in the education department utilize the same format for the Masters research project at every level of the program.
3		Due to the on-line classes I have had the feedback and interaction with classmates and teachers have been very minimal and I think that is a bid disadvantage. Especially since this field is counseling and that is a contact field.
4		More advising services and direction would help to improve the program.
5		I really felt like my time at UT Martin has been very engaging. I have learned a great deal and have had to do so primarily on my own by just being an online student. However, I have logged many reading hours and completed numerous assignments that have given my insight and experience that otherwise would not have had and for that I have really enjoyed my learning experiences here at UTM.
6		Most of the knowledge and skills I need to be a teacher, I had coming into the program. While I enjoyed several of my classes, I did not find that the program significantly added to or reinforced any particular teaching skills, with the two exceptions of classroom management and technology. The multicultural class was insufficient for understanding how to truly assess one's own biases (I have had much more thorough diversity training elsewhere), much less apply multiculturalism to education except in the most superficial ways. I experienced blatant (yet unrecognized) prejudice on the part of other students (which I expected) and the professor (of whom I had hoped better). The research sequence was disjointed at best. I understand and appreciate the convenience of online classes, but find that they end up being largely self-taught (and at greater expense). I believe there are committed people in the program who want to provide excellent training; I just didn't experience that in the program as a whole.
