Hi, Jeff. I met yesterday with ECCE off-campus center directors and advisors for elementary (K-6) programs that we offer at the extended campus centers to discuss spring scheduling and program/student needs.

As we begin to prepare spring 2009 schedules, I wanted to pass along a request that was echoed several times where I hope you might have some suggestions. UTM students taking courses at the Parson, Selmer and Ripley centers need GEOG 151 or 152 and GEOL 110 to complete requirements for the bachelors degree with K-6 teaching licensure. Directors have not been successful in identifying potential adjuncts to submit for approval to teach these courses.

If you are aware of any potential adjuncts who would be able to teach GEOG 151 or 152 or the GEOL 110 courses at the extended campus sites, it would be great if you could share their names with the center directors. Another thought I had was the possibility of a DL course from main campus to an extended site.

Thanks in advance for any ideas or assistance you might provide as to ways we can help our UTM K-6 teacher education students gain access to these courses in Ripley, Selmer and Parsons.
