• **Dr. Alice-Catherine Carls**, professor of history, recently had a translation of Jan Zielinski's "Magiczny kwadrat" [Le carré magique], into French in *Magiczny kwadrat, Antologia*, a presentation of the Swiss authors who were the guests of the 50th Warsaw International Book Fair (Bern, CH: Pro Helvetia, 2005, pp. 46-64). On June 17, she was an organizer and keynote speaker at the University of Paris-Sorbonne, France, Comparative Literature Research Center. Her presentation, "Colloquium for Anna Frajlich," was the first presentation of Anna Frajlich's works in France with the poetess's participation. Carls' French translations of her poems were read. Carls also presented a paper, "Temps et espace de l'écrit: les chronotopes multiples de Claude Michel Cluny," at the University of Paris-Sorbonne, Comparative Literature Research Center. The conference was organized in honor of Claude Michel Cluny. She also served as chair of the concluding session. Carls had a book chapter, "Temps et

## Summer enrollment record set

Summer enrollment set an all-time record with 2,148 students enrolled for classes, breaking the previous high of 2,097 set in 1975. Enrollment increased 10.4 percent compared to summer 2004. All enrollment numbers are compiled and reported by the university's Office of Institutional Research.

Undergraduate students totaled 1,694 students compared to 1,643 in summer 2004 for a 3.1 percent increase. Graduate students totaled 454 students compared to 303 in summer 2004 for a 49.8 percent increase.

Undergraduate student numbers included participants in the Tennessee Governor's School for the Humanities and the Tennessee Governor's School for the Agri-

cultural Sciences, both held at UT Martin. High school students attending these Governor's Schools earned six hours of college credit, a first for the summer programs that were expanded from four to five weeks.

Graduate-student numbers continue to reflect interest in the university's new online graduate degree in educational administration and supervision that began fall 2004. The online degree is offered by the UT Martin Department of Educational Studies through UT New College located at the Martin campus.

"The strong summer enrollment numbers are encouraging," said Dr. Nick Dunagan, university chancellor. "The involvement of the two

Governor's Schools in regular-credit courses is great for those students and for UT Martin. We continue to be very pleased with interest in the new online graduate education degree."

Early enrollment numbers for fall semester 2005 continue to show increases compared to the same period last year. Students enrolled for classes following the fourth and final Summer Orientation and Registration session total 5,490 compared to 5,051 for fall 2004, an 8.7 percent increase. A record 6,104 students enrolled for fall 2004 classes.

Registration for fall semester continues with classes set to begin Aug. 29. Information about UT Martin is available by calling 1-800-829-UTM1.

## Gresham named UTNAA Distinguished Service Professor

Dr. Jerry Gresham, chairman of the Department of Agriculture and Natural Resources, recently was named the recipient of a University of Tennessee National Alumni Association (UTNAA) Alumni Distinguished Service Professorship.

The \$3,000 faculty award is an annual salary supplement to be continued until the recipient retires from full-time university employment, or relinquishes professorial duties and assumes a non-academic, administrative

position. To be eligible for selection, a professor must demonstrate effectiveness in teaching and distinction in a subject matter or professional field as evidenced by publications or other appropriate demonstrations of distinction.

"Jerry gives 110 percent to his teaching and his leadership in the Department of Agriculture

and Natural Resources," said Chancellor Nick Dunagan. "He is truly an international figure in the field of animal science. UT Martin is very fortunate to have his energy and dedication."

"It was quite a surprise," said Gresham, who added that he appreciates the recognition and honor. "There are a lot of people deserving. I want to thank Chancellor Dunagan and others who made this recognition possible.

"What I appreciate most about my career at UT Martin is the

opportunity to be associated with so many great people – especially the students," he added. "One of the unique things as faculty is that we meet a lot of young people as students and we are then able to follow them in their careers as they become leaders in their communities and career fields."

Gresham, professor of animal science since 1973, received bachelor of science, master of science and doctoral degrees from Oklahoma State

University. He was named chair of the department in 2003. He also serves as director of the Tennessee Governor's School for the Agricultural Sciences and director of the Center of Excellence for Experiential Learning in the Agricultural Sciences. Gresham is a member of the American Meat Science Association and the American Society of Animal Science. He received the UT Martin Cunningham Outstanding Teacher/Scholar Award in 2003 and the Outstanding Academic Advisor Award in 1990. He currently serves on the UT Martin

Research and Development Committee.

Gresham has numerous publications and presentations to his credit, has secured grant funding for the establishment of a Livestock Merchandising Center, and construction funds for a sheep and meat goat teaching/research center and other projects at UT Martin. He is a consultant for the Norwegian Beef Breeders Association and Classic Medical in Florida.

Dr. Paul Sharma, professor of biology, also is a UTNAA Alumni Distinguished Service professor at UT Martin.
