## Organ Week slated Feb. 28-March 4

The Department of Music will host Organ Week Feb. 28 through March 4. The week will feature two concerts and a workshop with the use of an Allen demonstration organ loaned to the department by Amro Music of Memphis. All activities will be held in the Harriet Fulton Theatre of the Fine and Performing Arts Building. They are open to the public at no admission charge and include the following:

- Feb. 28, 8 p.m., a concert featuring Allen guest artist, Michael Stairs, provided by Amro Music of Memphis, Allen organ franchisee. Stairs is organist for the Philadelphia Orchestra, has held the Buck Chair in Music at The Haverford School in Haverford, Pa., and is director of music and organist at the Church of the Redeemer in Byrn Mawr, Pa.;
- March 1, 8 p.m., organ workshop, "Organ 101: Introduction to the Organ," with Dr. Scott Roberts, professor of music, explaining the "nuts and bolts" of organs;
- March 4, 8 p.m., concert featuring Roberts performing seven of his original compositions and several masters' works.

The organ events are being held, in part, to showcase the department's church music sequence, established in 2003 and the only church music program at a public university in West Tennessee.

"The sequence was created to address the shortage of church musicians in West Tennessee," said Dr. Kevin Lambert, Department of Music chair.

of the Titans." He is the National Football League's (NFL) youngest play-by-play announcer and the first ever to be associated with Tennessee's NFL team.

Keith hosted a pre-game show for the team in Houston in 1996 for Tennessee stations that carried the Oilers' games. In 1997, he served as the network's scoreboard host before becoming color analyst in 1998. By May of 1998, Keith joined the Titans full-time as director of broadcasting, after becoming one of Tennessee's most honored sportscasters while working in Knoxville for WIVK/WNOX Radio and the Vol Radio Network.

In 1999, Keith assumed the play-by-play duties for the Titans and joined former

University of Tennessee quarterback, Pat Ryan, and Titans executive producer, Larry Stone, to call the Titans' Superbowl run, which included the well-known "Miracle Play" that landed Keith and Ryan national recognition.
