Participants attended workshops, panel discussions, performances and keynote speeches by such theatre luminaries as actress Dixie Carter and playwright Samm-Art Williams. While there, undergraduates, Jennifer Horbelt (sophomore, Memphis) and Derrick Casey (sophomore, Humboldt), both of whom had been chosen from Tennessee Theatre Association screening auditions in October 2004, took part in the professional theatre auditions. Approximately 200 theatres were represented and more than 800 students auditioned for summer theatre positions. Horbelt and Casey, along with Victoria Shaw (senior, Dyer) and Stephanie Dowell (senior, Nashville) will perform this summer with *Twilight Cabaret* at Kentucky Lake. Also attending the convention was UT Martin graduate Kevin Shell (Communications, 2003), who recently received a full assistantship to the University of Florida Graduate School in the MFA program in acting. At the convention, Shell was awarded the Robert Porterfield Graduate Award of \$2,500.

Falgas is speaker March 23

Jordi Falgas, the Cleveland Fellow in modern art at the Cleveland Museum of Art, will speak at 4 p.m., March 23, in the Norman Campbell Lecture Hall of the Andy Holt Humanities Building. His topic will be, "100 Years of Avida Dollars: Salvador Dali, Where Art Means Business."

Falgas received a bachelor's degree from the Universitat de Barcelona in 1988, a master's degree from Michigan State University in 1995 and is in the doctoral program at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He also is currently assisting in the organization of a major exhibition devoted to modern art from Barcelona at the Cleveland Museum of Art.

From 1988-1992, he worked as a journalist

and art critic for the Catalan newspaper *El Punt* and as assistant executive manager at the Salvador Dalí Foundation in Figueres, Spain. He is the author of the Dalí monograph, "Dalí: Paint-er, paint!" and has lectured, published articles and organized several exhibitions on Dalí and other modern and contemporary Spanish artists.

Research, grant writing course slated

The Office of Extended Campus and Continuing Education (ECCE) will offer a research and grant writing course, from 8 a.m.-5 p.m., March 30-April 1. The course fee is \$294.

Instructor Victoria Schneider Lake, director of business development at West Tennessee Healthcare, is responsible for grant and proposal writing of all West Tennessee Healthcare affiliates, designated community, public and not-for-profit agencies.

The workshop will teach students how to research and seek grant opportunities and offer hands-on experience in writing each section of a grant proposal. Participants will learn about grant availability, what information to include in preparing a proposal, how to make a "pitch" and how to improve a department's probabilities of receiving the award.

During the first day, students will learn how to research and find federal, state and foundation grant opportunities to match the needs and strategies for community collaboration. Students also will learn how to read request for proposals (RFPs) with an emphasis on key words
