Mini-Grants to Teacher Consultants from WTWP, 2003-04

Eligibility:

1. All Teacher Consultants of WTWP may apply for a WTWP mini-grant. Maximum amount of award per Teacher Consultant is \$100. A total of \$1000 is available for mini-grants to TC's for 2003-2004.
2. Grants will be awarded for teacher professional development and for projects that lead to greater literacy among students K-college.
3. Grant activity must be completed and a final narrative suitable for publication in *Field Notes* or a journal of the National Writing Project must be received by the WTWP Director by May 1, 2004 in order for grant to be processed. Grants for projects completed before May 1, 2004 will be processed immediately upon project completion, including receipt of report by the WTWP Director.
4. Successful applicants must complete one-page application (guidelines follow) and also must include registration for and be present at the August 2, 2003 WTWP workshop in Jackson for introductions and recognition at lunch. August workshop registration information is available off the WTWP homepage: www.utm.edu/wtwp
5. Grant applications, including registration for WTWP Jackson workshop Aug. 2, are due at WTWP, 131 Humanities Building, University of Tennessee at Martin, Martin, 38238, by June 20, 2003. Only hard copy applications will be considered; electronic submissions, including FAX, will not be considered.
6. If number of applications exceeds funds available, grant applications with earliest postmark will have preference. Preference may be given to Teacher Consultant applicants not previously receiving WTWP mini-grants.

Application:

Compose a one-page application, single or double spaced, but only one page, that includes:

- Your name, home address, school name and address, home phone, and e-mail address.
- Title of project.
- What you expect to accomplish.
- Description of how your project will lead to more and stronger reading and writing.
- How you will evaluate the success of your project.

Reminder: To be considered, mini-grant application must include the TC's registration for August 2, 2003 Jackson workshop. Grant application deadline: June 20, 2003.
