What is Key Leader Weekend?

It is an extraordinary opportunity for high school students, ages 14-18, to obtain leadership skills by participating in hands on experiences which help them understand what it means to hold onto your values. There are opportunities for students to be put into real situations with real consequences, and after experiencing these moments, to acquire self-confidence and leadership ability.

Students come away from this weekend as a better person with a positive outlook on life. They make friends for a lifetime. They learn to connect with other students from all types of different backgrounds, and they learn what it means to be a team player. They learn that in order to be a leader, you must put others first, and that you must work together to successfully complete any project.

Who can attend?

Key Leader Weekend is for High School students ages 14-18 and is also open to rising students that will be going to the 9th grade in the Fall of 2022. We are led by a certified instructor trained at Kiwanis International.

What do students need to bring?

We stay in dormitory style cabins. Students have a packing list provided. **Masks may be required.** Students are to bring sheets and a blanket or sleeping bag, pillow, toiletries, clothes for the weekend, towel, flashlight, etc. Our camp is located east of Camden, TN and is right on the Tennessee River. **Meals are included in the fees.** We also provide healthy snacks between meals.
