Call Me Mister! The Call Me MiSTER® (Mentors Instructing Students Toward Effective Role Models) program strives to increase the pool of available teachers from a more diverse background, particularly among Tennessee's lowest performing elementary schools.

Student participants are largely selected from among under-served, socio-economically disadvantaged and educationally at-risk communities. Call Me MiSTER® is a teacher leadership program that provides the participants, who are entitled "Call Me MiSTER® Scholars," with the tools necessary to succeed as pre-service teachers. With the preparation and support from the Call Me MiSTER® program, students will go on to pursue successful careers in elementary and middle schools in Tennessee. Currently the program offers degrees in Interdisciplinary Studies, Secondary Education, and Special Education.
