Dr. Phil Cavalier Provost and UTM Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, gave a presentation entitled “Academics and COVID” when he visited Kiwanis on May 4.

Dr. Cavalier mentioned the Joy of being back in classrooms again after five semesters of making needed adjustments. He said that UTM has taken—and continues to take—precautions for the safety of students, faculty, and staff. He said that for the most part UTM faculty and students made transitions smoothly from traditional to virtual and hybrid classrooms.

Dr. Cavalier also noted the legislative appropriation for the Tennessee Entrepreneurial Science and Technology (TEST) Hub. The TEST Hub will combine educational facilities, entrepreneurial centers and manufacturing workshops surrounding a shared industrial maker space. In partnership with the Tennessee Colleges of Applied Technology and Dyersburg State Community College, the facility will offer educational opportunities at the certificate, associate and bachelor’s degree levels, as well as career and technical education (CTE) opportunities for the region’s high schools.
