Laura began the session with an interactive study of the muscles and bones of the human body. She had students learning the names of the major muscle and bones. It was decided that “calf muscle” was much easier to say than *gastrocnemius!*

The second half to the session had the kids divided into pairs to work through a star shaped hand-out. Each pair had to name an indicated bone or muscle then perform an activity (see crab crawl) that required some form of exercise. Once the activity was completed, students got to color in part of the star. There was much action and many bodies in motion!

of the American Chemical Society (SMACS), which Dr. Shelton advises, entertained Kiwanians with two demonstrations that illustrated chemical properties—the first was “burning” a \$10 bill after soaking it in a solution of alcohol and water and the second was mixing three clear solutions and watching the colors change from blue to yellow and back to clear again as the chemicals interacted.

Dr. Shelton said that she and student members of SMACS are available for outreach in area schools and want to communicate the value of knowing more about chemistry.
