Communications Access Real-time Translation (CART) for hearing impaired students – a real person listens to a lecture via a microphone in the classroom and types the exact lecture being delivered, real-time for the student to read.

JAWS – a screen reader program in many of the computer labs for visually impaired students.

Mandatory Placement

WHAT IS THIS.... And WHY does my student have to take Reading 100????

Placement in one or more of the following courses is mandatory for students with *ACT composite scores less than 21* whose placement results show they need to enroll in: English 100, Mathematics 100 and/or Reading 100. ACT score of 21 and higher the placement is recommended but not required. (for more information see page 34 of the 2014-2015 catalog)

Mandatory Placement Hold

The "hold"

The mandatory placement hold is applied to a student record after he/she is admitted to the University. The hold is monitored by the Student Success Center. The hold is *informational only* and will not keep the student from seeing his/her grades or enrolling for classes. The mandatory placement class(es) must be completed within the first two years of academic study or 60 semester hours.
