Many students need to be able to record their lectures due to various disabilities ranging from physically not being able to write well enough to take notes, to impairments that impede the ability to get a message through the ears, to the brain and translated to motions of a pen on a piece of paper.

Recording lectures is very helpful to those who need this accommodation. Disability Services has more than 65 recorders checked out to students across campus. Some students have requested to use their phones to record and have been told that there is a “no phone” policy in the classroom. Phones are particularly useful because they sync easily to a car or computer.

Please consider the use of a phone if the student makes that request.

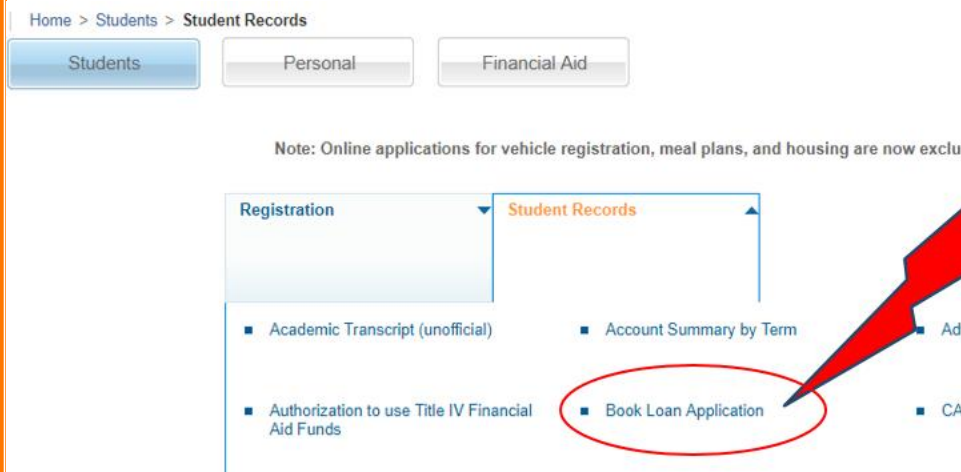
At the beginning of each semester we identify the classrooms that will need a table for a student in a wheelchair and we move the tables around. It is problematic if those tables have disappeared.

We also have alternate seating that can be used when a student cannot use a conventional desk or must have a seat with padding or a back rest.

We hopefully have tags on this furniture, but if we don't, please let us know. If these items are in the way, please move them to a corner of the classroom. If they need to be relocated, we can do that also.
